About the trainers

Anne Laure Humbert, PhD, is Professor of Gender and Statistics and Co-Director of the Centre for Diversity Policy Research and Practice at Oxford Brookes University. Anne has worked extensively on developing methodologies and indicators for measuring gender equality in multiple settings. She specializes in applying quantitative methods to comparative social and economic analysis. Recent projects include; implementing gender equality plans in universities across Europe (GEARING-Roles); measuring and addressing gender-based violence in higher education in Europe (UniSAFE); and supporting research and higher education institutions in establishing safe, inclusive, and respectful environments by setting up comprehensive policies to effectively counteract gender-based violence (GenderSAFE).

Nathalie Wuiame is a Belgian lawyer. She is a member of the Supporter core team of UGOT. She has specific experience in European policy and research projects on gender equality, gender mainstreaming and gender-based violence in different contexts, including in sport. She has been involved in capacity-building activities to support effective policies against gender-based violence, design and implementation of gender equality plans and structural changes in academia.
